# GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS

## ENTRIES

- 1) Entry & Stalling fees- **page 7 for Commercial Cattle, page 11 for Commercial Lamb, page 18 for Breeding Ewe Lamb, page 20 for Pedigree Calves and page 14 for Pigs**
- 2) Please make cheques payable to **"East of England Agricultural Society"**
- 3) The VAT registration number of the Society is 576 6533 04
- 4) There will be **NO REMINDER OF ENTRIES CLOSING DATE**
- 5) Entries must be on the correct form.
- 6) All entry fees must be paid at the time of entry. **INCORRECT ENTRIES MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED**
- 7) Late entries will **NOT** be accepted
- 8) **NO SUBSTITUTIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED**

## CLASSES

- 9) All classes are open unless otherwise stated. Entries may be made at the fees stated in the current prize list. All stock exhibited for prizes shall be bona fide in the legal ownership of the exhibitor at the time of entry or for such a period as shall be set out under the conditions of the particular class concerned
- 10) The Society reserves the rights to amalgamate or cancel classes should any classification fail to attract sufficient entries. Exhibitors will be notified accordingly
- 11) The Society reserves the right to cancel any class or to limit entries from an individual if entries are too numerous
- 12) The Chief Steward reserves the right to alter the class schedules for a Judge if it is found necessary at the event and to amend the programme or alter the judges or judging rings should circumstances demand

## WELFARE OF ALL LIVESTOCK

- 13) All exhibitors must ensure they comply fully with the 2007 EU WELFARE OF ANIMALS DURING TRANSPORT REGULATION (EC) No 1/2005 For the purposes of this article, mammals shall not be considered fit for transport if they
  - a) Are unfit animals (see DEFRA website Annex 1 Chapter 1 of Council Regulation 1/2005)
  - b) Are pregnant female animals that have reached the latest stage of gestation (within 10% of the estimated time of the gestation before birth) and for a period of one week after giving birth.
  - c) Are very young animals except if the journey is less than 100km, e.g. calves of less than 10 days of age, pigs less than 3 weeks of age and lambs of less than one week
  - d) Calves of less than 14 days of age on journeys exceeding 8 hours will not be permitted
- 14) No animals are to be left on vehicles overnight
- 15) The East of England Agricultural Society promotes best practice to all exhibitors
- 16) Livestock being housed at the East of England Showground will be subject to inspections from our allocated show veterinary officer to ensure stock are in good health

## IDENTIFICATION AND PASSPORTS

- 17) ALL STOCK entered in the show may be inspected and marked should the committee so desire
- 18) Cattle passports are required for all bovines born on or after 1 July 1996. The passport must accompany the animals and remain on the Showground for the duration of the animal's attendance. The movement to and from the Show should be entered on the passport. The passport should be completed in the usual way for any other movements of the animals.
- 19) Sheep exhibitors must produce a completed ARAMS-1 form on arrival and departure from the showground
- 20) Pigs must be identified in accordance with current legal requirements and accompanied by correct movement documentation
- 21) **SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER: 05/350/8000**

## CATTLE

- 22) All stock remains the responsibility of the exhibitor whilst on the Showground and must be attended at all times
- 23) Cattle must have proper halters when on the Showground and be properly tethered
- 24) All cattle must be halter trained and lead, in both the show and sale rings except if otherwise stated in the schedule
- 25) All Bulls/bull calves must have a nose ring and all entries must be either double-haltered in their stalls or pens, or secured with a strong halter and a neck band
- 26) All cattle must be entered in the Herd Books or supplementary register of their respective breeds
- 27) All pure-bred cattle entries **MUST** be able to produce a copy of the Breed Society Birth Registration or Notification Certificate, or written confirmation from the Breed Society upon request
- 28) **TUBERCULOSIS & BRUCELLOSIS:** All cattle must be from herds on which no movement restrictions have been served by DEFRA. No animal accepted for entry may be exhibited if, after entry, such movement controls are imposed
- 29) **TB continued; ALL EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THE CURRENT TB REGULATIONS.** Pre-movement and post-movement testing of cattle must be in accordance with government guidelines stated on the gov.uk website

- 30) All cattle moving from premises in parishes with a 1-year testing interval must have undergone a TB test with a negative result within 60 days of the animal moving onto the showground. A **COPY** of the clear TB test certificate **MUST** be sent into the Livestock Office before arrival or handed in **BEFORE** unloading at the show. Any exhibitor who fails to comply with this rule will be removed from the showground
- 31) New advice from the TB advisory service; Cattle keepers in the high risk and edge areas of England qualify for free TB Advice. Experienced on farm consultants are available to give advice by telephone or during bespoke on farm visits. The TB Advisory Service can give advice on TB biosecurity including managing cattle to cattle and wildlife transmission risk and also ways to build resilience to a TB breakdown into your business
- 32) A TB breakdown means movement restrictions, which would mean an end to showing, until you are clear. The show committee would encourage all of those who qualify to take advantage of this free advice to minimise the risk of this happening. As part of the cattle industry, want to do all we can to reduce this devastating disease
- 33) An animal may be entered into either the Commercial Cattle section **or** the Pedigree Calves, not both

#### **SHEEP**

- 34) **SHORT DOCKING OF SHEEP:** Exhibitors attention is drawn to the Welfare of Livestock (Prohibited Operations) Regulations 1982 (Short tail docking of sheep). The Society reserves the right to prohibit the showing of any sheep which are considered to have been over docked and may require the removal of these sheep from the Showground
- 35) There are no provisions for segregating sheep originating from flocks having an Elite Health Scheme or Disease Control Programme. Exhibitors bringing such animals do so at their own risk
- 36) No In-Lamb Ewes to be exhibited at the show
- 37) Artificially coloured Sheep will not be acceptable
- 38) **SHEEP SCAB:** It is an offence to move sheep that are visibly affected by sheep scab
- 39) After weighing at the show, at the discretion of the Chief Steward:
  - Any class with 3 or more entries forward will be retained for judging
  - Any class with less than 3 entries forward will be transferred to an alternative class
  - Any Breed with 3 or more entries forward in an Any Other Breed/Sired Class, will be allocated a separate sub-class for judging (except Crossbred and Natural classes and Young Handler Classes)
  - Any Class with 10 or more entries forward may be sub-divided by weight
- 40) All wether lambs (including those for carcass competitions) must have been castrated before attaining the age of three months
- 41) All lambs must be tagged with their flock/herd number and individual identification number before leaving their holding. Exhibitors must ensure that they comply with the requirements of National Legalisation for recording, identification and movement of sheep in force at the time of the event. Exhibits must be tagged with their individual identification number in such a way for it to be clearly visible and in accordance with DEFRA regulations

#### **PIGS**

- 42) Movements to the Showground must be pre-notified via eAML2, please bring a copy of the 'on movement' to hand to the chief Steward on arrival
- 43) All stock remains the responsibility of the exhibitor whilst on the Showground and must be attended at all times
- 44) Entries will be weighed on arrival and if necessary classes will be re-allocated
- 45) Pigs to be owned by entrant for a minimum of 10 weeks prior to the 29<sup>th</sup> November
- 46) Pigs for sale must stay on the showground for the duration of the show
- 47) Any entrants with livestock in Farm Assurance Schemes are asked to bring backup documentation

#### **ALL SECTIONS**

- 48) **STRAW** will be provided by the Society but quality cannot be guaranteed
- 49) **OBJECTIONS:** Any exhibitor at the Show feeling himself aggrieved must make his protest in writing within one hour of the completion of the judging of the class to which it refers and pay a deposit to the Secretary of £50 (or such other higher sum as determined by any organisation to which this Society is affiliated or acts under the rule of). Objections will not be entertained from any person or organisation not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. An Appeals Tribunal will consider objections, (excepting those handled by other appropriate organisations) at a time and place to be fixed by them and the person making the objection must be available to attend or, be represented by his authorised agent at the appointed time and place. The decision of the Appeals Tribunal shall be final, and if the protest be not substantiated the deposit may be forfeited. The animal to which the objection is raised must remain on the Showground until permission to leave has been obtained from the Secretary in writing. The Society reserves to itself the right to refer an objection to any authority or organisation to adjudicate, wholly or in part, in respect of an objection, on behalf of the Society
- 50) **INSURANCE:** It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to insure all property and livestock on the Showground or elsewhere which is his own, or for which he is responsible. The Society requires exhibitors to affect Employers Liability insurance where this is required by statute. The Society also requires exhibitors to affect Public Liability and Products Liability to the value of £2 million. Exhibitors are asked to provide copies of their public liability cover when they make an entry
- 51) **ISOLATION BOX:** An isolation box is provided and must be used for any animal that has either given birth prematurely or aborted

- 52) **PRIZE MONEY:** Event prize money will be paid by BACS to the exhibitor as soon as practical after the event. Any outstanding debts due to the organisers may be deducted from any payments due to the exhibitor. In the event of an objection against any winning entry, prize money will be withheld until such dispute is resolved. Entrants failing to provide BACS details on entry forms will not receive prize money
- 53) **Exhibitors are reminded that ALL enclosed areas on the Showground are Smoke Free.** Smoking **IS NOT allowed** in any indoor area including the cattle sheds, arena buildings or any livestock buildings at any time. Exhibitors or their stockmen who break this rule may be barred from competing at future shows

#### **AUCTION**

- 54) The Auction will be conducted under the LAA conditions of sale
- 55) Purchasers are reminded that the "risk" on purchased lots falls on them at the 'fall of the hammer'
- 56) Commission on all stock sold by auction will be charged at the normal market commission rate. For stock offered by auction and withdrawn, commissions will be charged at full rate
- 57) Sheep & Pig Supreme Champions and Reserve Champions, **MUST BE OFFERED FOR SALE**

#### **ACCOMMODATION**

- 58) On the showground caravans can park in the area provided
- 59) Off the showground, please find details of local accommodation on Page 5

#### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

- 60) Exhibitors and Stock Attendants must be fully aware of their obligations for the safety of the general public and fellow exhibitors/stock attendants at all times whilst at the Event and observe orders given by stewards or officials when leading stock to and from the Judging Rings
- 61) Exhibitors and Stock Attendants must take every precaution to protect visitors to the livestock lines from injury
- 62) Exhibitors must ensure that Electrical Appliances and cables have been properly maintained and inspected for safety before being brought to the Showground and must be accompanied by a safety test certificate issued within the preceding 12 months
- 63) The use of electrical appliances with long leads which traverse the floor of the building is prohibited
- 64) Grooming shall only take place in the designated areas. Blowers are not permitted in the wash area
- 65) At least one competent person shall attend each animal during its movement to and from the Event ring. Exhibitors must control and take every care when moving their animals and endeavour to segregate the public from their animal when moving through the venue. Handlers must act upon any instructions given by Event Officials
- 66) Cattle Trimming Frames are not permitted in the cattle stalling
- 67) Sheep holding devices must only be used in the designated areas
- 68) Avenues must be kept clear of fodder and bedding
- 69) Cattle must be double halter tied, through the rails and loop ring. Binder twine or string must not be used to tie cattle.
- 70) Smoking is prohibited in the livestock lines and all enclosed spaces
- 71) Under no circumstance will kettles, primus or other cooking stoves be permitted anywhere within the livestock buildings.
- 72) Generators are not permitted anywhere on the Showground
- 73) Caravan Electric Hook Up is available please complete the relevant section on the entry form. Please note: Caravan Electric Hook Up will only be provided for those who request it on the entry forms. Any Person seen to have a Caravan Electric Hook Up plugged into the cattle buildings or a point that has not been paid for will have the electricity removed by the society
- 74) The above regulations are an addition to any prevailing health and safety policies and directions in place on the showground

#### **YOUTH PARTICIPATION**

- 76) Stock Attendants under the age of 14 are not permitted in the judging ring with the exception of Young Handler Classes.
- 77) Under 18s must have the signed consent of a parent or guardian to take part in the Young Stock Person of the Year Final. For the College Challenge, the lecturer assumes the role of Guardian for students taking part in the competition, a signed entry form must be provided before the event. These forms will be available from the Winter Stock Festival Website or available at the Livestock Office on the day of the show

#### **ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION, BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS:**

- a) The Show is held under the Articles of Association, By-Laws and Regulations of the East of England Agricultural Society and the Code of Practice for Safety and Accident Prevention, which accordingly binds all exhibitors, members of the participating Agricultural Societies and all other attending the Show
- b) **COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL AUTHORITY REGULATIONS AND ALL CODES OF PRACTICE:** All Shows, Exhibitions and Events organised by the Society on the Showground or elsewhere are subject to any relevant Orders issued by Government Departments and Local Authorities, and all Codes of Practice with which all exhibitors and others attending such Shows, Exhibitions and Events must comply
- c) Exhibitors' attention is also drawn to the Breed Regulation and Competition conditions printed in the Prize List
- d) Copies of the Articles of Association, By-Laws and Regulations can be obtained on request to the Secretary of the Society
